

## Guiding Principle For Razz Poker Game

Anyone that knows to play seven stud will not find it difficult to play razz poker game since stud is played for high and Razz poker game is played for low. Like in most games there are starting hand recommendations for a Razz poker game and when you make your play based on those guidelines you will definitely play a better game.

• A23, A24, A25, A34, A35, A45, 234, 235 are the best starting hands in a razz poker game. Though there are some players that will play razz with any 3 low cards, the best way to playing tight and conservative is to stick on to playing A23, A24, A25, A34, A35, A45, 234, 235.

If you have been high card winning for quite a long time and are trying to check in to razz poker game for a change, just check in for an online razz poker game poker room practice there and then play in money games. This is very necessary because many of the hands that you will automatically fold in a high card game are likely the valuable hands in this variant of poker. You need to understand that the value for Ace in Razz poker game is nothing more than digit 1.

• There is no value in Razz poker game if you are going to hold a pair, set, straight, flushes, or full house.

• Any card that is over 8 has to value in this game.

Understanding the worthless hand that you can fold in the third street of Razz poker game is very simple. If you are going to have any 3 cards that have one high card or two high card or a medium low card, then you will have to automatically understand you are having a bad stand in the game and you need to better fold.

However, some hands can meet with improvement in the fourth street of razz poker game or they can go worse. In exceptional cases you can wait for improvement until the fourth street and if they do not improve just fold. Hands like AK8 will either improve or go worse. If you are going to play trap hands beyond Fourth Street you are committing the common trap hand error. Understand the hands that should not be played beyond Fourth Street and be smart enough to fold them there. In short, avoid playing too many draw hands.
